

PRONOUNCING DEATH

Practice FAQs APRIL 2022

QUESTION

Can a Respiratory Therapist pronounce death within our hospital?

ANSWER

There is no legal requirement that death be pronounced by a physician, and there is nothing in legislation that would prevent an RT from pronouncing death, as this is, simply put, identifying a lack of vital signs. Considered public domain, this does not fall under a controlled act, so RT's may perform. It is important to note that RT's can not **certify** death (signing a Medical Certificate of Death), under the <u>Vital Statistics Act</u>. Certifying a death is the legal process of attesting to the fact, cause, and manner of someone's death, in writing, on the form prescribed by the local authority. Each province and territory has legislation governing who can certify a death.

As always, RT's must follow their facility's policies and protocols with respect to this subject.
